HELPING NEIGHBORS IN NEED

Local Missions Ministry

Each day, members of the Spartanburg community are in need of physical, spiritual, and financial support. Following the Biblical command to love our neighbors, First Presbyterian strives to care for those around us in ways that truly make a difference and spread God's love. Our missions provide critical care to people who are most vulnerable and often overlooked—from the hungry to the homeless to the heartbroken and beyond.

The Local Missions ministry at First Presbyterian supports nonprofit organizations throughout Spartanburg each year. All organizations are vetted by a team of committee members, and the main criteria is that the organization must align with the mission and vision of the Faith Initiative to End Child Poverty. Each winter, the Local Missions Committee prayerfully and diligently reviews grant applications for organizations that have requested funding. CELEBRATING 10 YEARS OF MINISTRY FOR GOD'S HOMELESS CHILDREN

In March of 2014, members of First
Presbyterian Church learned there were
children living in motels who had to utilize
parking lots for playgrounds and television sets
for recreation. The realization that this was
happening right across the street from the
church, as well as in communities throughout
the county was alarming. Gloria Close began to
bring food, clothing, and basic necessities to
families living in motels, and FPC members
offered children three week-long day camps
during the summer. Through participating in the
camps, long- term relationships between church
volunteers and homeless families were forged
and all their lives were changed.

Over the course of 10 years, hundreds of volunteers have shared their time, talent, and resources to help CAST families and to facilitate summer camps. Children are able to learn about math, language arts, science, music, visual arts, recreation, cooking, communication skills, citizenship, nutrition, hygiene, life skills, and much more. Church staff and pastors also provide a worship service with music each week. Volunteers serve as mentors, teaching and encouraging families as they strive to grow.

While the primary mission of the ministry is to improve the lives of some of the most vulnerable children in our community (those living in motels, homeless shelters, and sleeping on floors), a second and important mission is to support families as they move out of those conditions.



It is difficult for families to save enough money for a deposit and/or the first month's rent needed to "get out" of living in a motel. When they find a home they can afford on their salary, CAST helps with the move-in costs. Gloria has utilized her own Facebook page and word of mouth to communicate needs like furniture, bedding, household items and food...and the items simply show up thanks to the generosity of our community. Many donate what they have, and they help put together beds, stock cabinets, and simply join in the excitement of move-in day at a family's new home. This simple day means so much to the families supported by this ministry. One child told his teacher that he had the best weekend of his life because he had food and a bed.



Because of CAST, twenty-two families have become self-sufficient and lives have been changed permanently.

Teresa, a mother of four children, writes, "CAST has been a blessing for me and my children. They have helped us get into a great home and helped with bills, furniture, household items, and groceries and also taught us how to budget. The kids love the summer camp. They get to meet wonderful people, learn things, and go on trips. I can truly say ya'll have made a great impact in our minds, lives, and family."





Anthony has participated in summer camps and is grateful for the time and resources poured into him, his family, and his friends. He writes, "I want to say thank you to all the volunteers who helped throughout the years. Camp gave me something to do over the summers and helped keep me out of trouble. CAST took a chance on me and my family. There were multiple times when my family and I were in motels and came very close to the verge of total homelessness. CAST pulled us out of that situation and helped my family into the home where we live now."

NEIGHBORHOOD MEAL MINISTRY

A PLACE WHERE EVERYONE IS WELCOME



Since 2011, the Neighborhood Meal Ministry has served our friends who are homeless or in need of assistance on Thursday evenings in the Arthur Center. Initially, the ministry served meals twice per month. Today, under the leadership of Betsy Burrell and Mary Lorick Thompson, this ministry serves 50 to 75 guests every Thursday.

Many things make this ministry special - quarterly communion for guests, monthly birthday recognitions, a friendly face and a non-judgmental environment, a prayer box, frequent visits from church staff and pastors, a weekly thanks to God for what he provides, and the tremendous number of people who have participated or contributed to the welfare of guests.



When the Meal Ministry resumed postpandemic, there was one monthly sponsor and just four guests showed up on reopening day. This time posed challenges for several reasons. Since those trying days, many volunteers and groups have joined to sponsor and serve our neighbors. Volunteers from several area churches now come together to serve, making this a true community outreach ministry.



While there are many hands to help the Neighborhood Meal Ministry, Betsy and Mary Lorick are always in need of new sponsors, servers, or shoppers.

"We welcome anyone who would like to participate in this meaningful ministry. Come give it a try, and we hope you will be as drawn to helping our neighbors as we are as you see God's hands in action," said Betsy and Mary Lorick.

A HELPING HAND

Many of our neighbors—including families with children—face food insecurity and a severe lack of resources. In Spartanburg, the poverty rate for children ages 6 to 17 years is 42%.

Realizing the urgency of this issue while driving near her neighborhood in 2020, Melissa France began working with school social workers in District 3 to identify families in greatest need. With a simple ask to friends, Melissa's front dining room began to fill up with non-perishable food items, paper and hygiene products, and cleaning supplies.

What began as an accidental discovery has now grown into much more. Melissa and many volunteers partner with social workers in Spartanburg School Districts 3, 6, and 7 to provide basic necessities and clothing. They have served to over 200 children to date.

Hand in Hand was founded on the belief that the well-being of each community member

affects the well-being of the community as a whole. The ministry has always operated under the principle that all human beings deserve dignity and respect, and that a lack of basic resources should not diminish this dignity.



Neely Darr is not only a member of the Young Adult Committee, she has been engaged in this ministry for a long time. She says her favorite thing about the Young Adult ministry is fellowship with others through Sunday School, Wednesdays at First, mission projects, and anytime this group comes together.

"Being a part of the YA ministry has benefitted my life as well as my family's by being a constant and steady reminder of God's love and presence. Whether worshipping or learning together, being prayed for when you're going through a tough time, having a meal dropped off - our church, and specifically the YA ministry, is God's love in action. That's an amazing thing to feel and be a part of!"

The Young Adult ministry connects people ages 22-40(ish) and welcomes anyone post-college through parents of early elementary school children.

"I would encourage others to become a part of the YA ministry to strengthen their faith and to develop fellowship that makes life much easier and more enjoyable," says Neely.
