SPARK (Room 2216) This class is made up of young adults in their 20's and 30's, both single and married, with and without children, who are interested in connecting and building relationships with each other, while exploring Christianity and the Bible and their applications to life.

WITNESS SEASON 2017

There is no real public education in Haiti; most schools in Haiti receive minimal government oversight and are too expensive to attend relative to average earnings. A U.S. Agency for International Development survey revealed that 75% of Haitian children at the end of first grade could not read a single word and 50% of the adult population is illiterate. First Presbyterian Church of Spartanburg has been a long-standing partner with Haiti Outreach Ministries (HOM) for many years, and continues to support the amazing educational projects that are happening there! Our Witness Season goal is to raise \$25,000 dollars towards the actual \$400,000 cost of building and outfitting a classroom to further the opportunities for higher grade levels of 10th, 11th, and 12th grade in Baryé Fè. It is expected to open in 2019.

Baryé Fè is a community near the Terre Noire campus of HOM, and the site of a new secondary school. This new school allows students to continue their secondary school education under the same outstanding HOM leadership they received as primary school students, where many of us in the FPC congregation have been sponsoring students. The school is open to any qualified student who wishes to continue their education past the 6th grade. Currently many students have to travel a great distance to a secondary school, making it difficult to pursue a higher education. By helping to building the secondary school in the community, we hope many more students can realize their dream of getting an education. The first part of the building, completed and dedicated in September 2015, welcomed our 7th grade students with classrooms opened for 7th and 8th grades in 2016. Once complete, the secondary school will include classrooms for 7th through 13th grades. Longer range plans include a vocational school and a Bible College on the Baryè Fè campus.
