Janie Alford was born in 1887 in Nashville, TN, and worked as a medical secretary. She briefly studied library science in college and helped start the library at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Nashville, where she was a charter member. She wrote this text in 1979 when she was ninety-two years old, although she had written poetry all her life. Hal Hopson encouraged Alford to write hymns based on the seasons of the church year. This hymn was included in Nine Hymns for the Church Year in response to that request.

STUDY: THE THEOLOGY OF MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

This week, Nan and Tom McDaniel will begin a new study on "The Theology of Martin Luther King, Jr." which will meet <u>Tuesdays in the Arthur Center OR Thursdays in the Library, 12-1pm</u>, and will conclude the week of Dec 1. Dr. King was a pastor before he became the leading voice of the Civil Rights Movement, and he remained a pastor and deep theological thinker throughout his life. His words and his actions were deeply grounded in his rich understanding of Christian theology. This timely study will explore that theology using Rufus Burrow, Jr.'s book, *Martin Luther King, Jr. for Armchair Theologians.* <u>Copies of the book are available in the church office for \$13</u>.
