Today's opening **hymn** has 19th-century German roots, with a translation by Edward Caswall, a Roman Catholic converted under the influence of Cardinal Newman and one of the foremost translators of hymns of his era, adapted by Robert Bridges, and set to music by English choirmaster Joseph Barnby.

Although, initially stirred by the sight of the rising sun in the first stanza of the hymn, we conclude in stanza four by singing our "canticle divine" - which becomes our "eternal song though all the ages long" that amplifies our praise to Christ.
