## WITNESS SEASON - FEBRUARY 2019

Every February is Witness Season here at FPC, and this year our Witness Season project is Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA). PDA is the emergency response program for our denomination, committed to the long-term journey of recovery of communities adversely affected by a crisis or catastrophic event. It has designated funds for responding to specific disasters. PDA has been tremendously helpful to the ongoing relief efforts after the flooding in North and South Carolina, and <u>our goal this Witness Season is to raise \$25,000 to assist our brothers and sisters in Christ who have been affected by the flooding in North and South Carolina.</u> There will be two programs to further explain this year's project: <u>Wednesday, February 20 at 6:30pm</u> and <u>Sunday, February 24 at 10am</u>.
