GIRL SCOUT RECOGNITION Saturday, March 12, marks the 110th birthday of the Girl Scouts. It commemorates the day in 1912 when Juliette Gordon Low officially registered the organization's first 18 girl members in Savannah, Georgia. Today, there are 2.5 million Girl Scouts – 1.7 million girl members and 750,000 adult members working primarily as volunteers. This morning, during the 11am Sanctuary Worship Service, we will recognize our Girl Scouts.
