Introduction and Statement of Purpose

One: In her baptism, Leslie was clothed with Christ. She was ordained to the ministry of Word and Sacrament by the Middle Tennessee Presbytery, and she is now called by God through the voice of the church to serve as Associate Pastor of this congregation.

- e. Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?
- f. Will you, in your own life, seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?
- g. Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church?
- h. Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?
- i. Will you be a faithful teaching elder, proclaiming the good news in Word and Sacrament, teaching faith, and caring for people? Will you be active in government and discipline, serving in the councils of the church; and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

- a. Do we, the members of the Church, accept Leslie Lang as our Associate Pastor, chosen by God through the voice of this congregation to guide us in the way of Jesus Christ?
