Two New Free Libraries!

Our rising 5th and 6th graders had a blast serving at VBS Plus. They cooked a full meal with the help of Jane Mullins and served it to our Neighborhood Meal Ministry friends, they ran Mobile Meals routes, and they painted and installed two "Free Little Libraries" into our community!! One of these libraries is installed <u>outside of the Arthur Center</u> and the children have dedicated it to "Ms. B" for her love and service to the children of our church. They installed <u>the other one at the Prince Hall Housing Authority</u> and, within the first day of installation, almost all the books had been borrowed! Their hope is that these books will reach children and parents who might not otherwise have access. They will be maintaining both libraries throughout the year and welcome any gently used book donations from our congregation!
