In 1887, George William Kitchin wrote the text on which this hymn is based. Emperor Constantine's vision "In this sign, thou shalt conquer" may have been the author's inspiration. Michael Robert Newbolt revised the text in 1916, making it less militaristic. The hymn was not printed in a U.S. hymnal until 1974, when it appeared in Hymns for the Living Church. It has since been included in numerous denominational hymnals.
