Charles Wesley wrote this hymn, and it was first published in 1744 in his brother John's Collection of Moral and Sacred Poems. Wesley originally wrote six stanzas, but hymnals vary on which of these are included today. Some form of this text is now found in almost every English-language hymnal in the world.
