Access/Key Card - New Information!

<u>On Sundays</u>, all entrances to the <u>Clark Building</u> will require key card access. The <u>Family Life Center</u> doors will be locked at 10:30am. In the <u>Main Building</u>, all doors will require key cards except for the Tower Room and Narthex's Main Street Facing Door. The Narthex side doors will close at 11:15am.

On Wednesday evenings, the monitored front doors of the Family Life Center are unlocked, but for other unmonitored doors around campus, including the Tower Room, Clark Building, and Chestnut Street doors, you will need your key card.

This is for the protection of all of us, but especially for the protection of the children. Key cards can now be made on-site for a cost of \$10.
