From The Confession of Belhar

We believe that Christ's work of reconciliation is made manifest in the church as the community of believers who have been reconciled with God and with one another. We believe that God has revealed God's self as the one who wishes to bring about

The Confession of Belhar was written in 1982 in South Africa during the time of apartheid. Interestingly, while apartheid is the human context for the Confession of Belhar, it is never explicitly mentioned in the confession. Instead, Belhar lifts up the heart of the Gospel as a bringer of hope for the human condition.
