COMMUNITY THANKSGIVING SERVICE

The Annual Community Thanksgiving Service will be hosted by St. Paul the Apostle Catholic Church (161 N. Dean St), 6:00-8:30pm. This annual service provides an opportunity for the community to gather together to collectively give thanks. All proceeds from the evening's offering will benefit SWITCH, an organization that fights human trafficking and sexual exploitation. SWITCH will use the funds to support its intervention program in the Spartanburg County Detention Center, providing trauma-informed care to women who are incarcerated and have a history of sexual exploitation.
