# SANCTUARY AND CHAPEL NEEDLEPOINT NEWS

This Christmas season, please consider giving the lasting gift of liturgical needlepoint in honor of or in memory of a friend or loved one.

The <u>communion bench cushions</u> display the shields of the twelve apostles, six on each cushion. In the cushion boxing is the name of each apostle whose shield is depicted. One cushion is already in place. The second is awaiting a finisher. (\$1,500) Twelve <u>alms basin silencers</u> (better known as collection plate silencers) are also in place. These are modeled after the rose window in the Chapel. One has already been reserved. (\$50)

Twelve of twenty-four <u>usher lapel badges</u> are available. Perhaps you've noticed greeters, ushers, deacons, and elders wearing these each Sunday and on other special occasions. (\$25)

We are currently in the process of placing four pairs of new <u>Bible markers</u> in the Chapel. These correspond in color to the church's liturgical seasons and depict either architectural designs or sacred monograms and symbols. The purple and white Bible markers have already been spoken for, but the green and red Bible markers may be reserved. (pair - \$300)

Pricing for the pieces includes the costs of design, wool, fabric, and finishing. Each has been needlepointed by FPC volunteers who have given the gifts of their time and talent to adorn the sanctuary or chapel, enhance the worship experience, and glorify God in this place.
