GIVEN THE CURRENT SERIOUS SPIKE IN COVID-19 case numbers nationally, in South Carolina, and in Spartanburg County, and given the prospect of further increases following the Christmas and New Year

holidays, we feel that the only prudent course of action for First Presbyterian Church, Spartanburg is to alter our worship schedule in the following way: For a period of three Sundays following Christmas Eve services, to include December 27th, January 3rd, and January 10th, we will worship via Livestream only (one service on December 27 and both MorningSong and Traditional Sanctuary services on January 3 and 10). After discussion with the Health Cabinet and church staff, and with the support of the Worship Committee, these changes were approved.
