The History of White Gift Services

The origin of the White Gift service is credited to the wife of a Methodist minister in 1904 in Ohio. She knew the legend of the Chinese people who loved their king so much that they each brought him a gift on his birthday. The gifts were all wrapped in white paper in order to emphasize the love of the people and the intent of the gift, not the size or value of it. The minister's wife and his daughters asked their congregation to bring a gift wrapped in white for their King, Jesus. These were often packages of food, the kind of thing that even the poorest in the congregation could bring. They were Christmas love gifts to be distributed to people in need in their community. This beautiful idea quickly spread around the Christian world in the early 1900s, and is still celebrated today in many congregations. White Gifts has been celebrated at FPC for over 50 years.

THE HOPE CENTER FOR CHILDREN (Spartanburg, SC) – Provides a continuum of care to meet the needs of the children and families in our community. Though we provide many different services, our name captures what is at the heart of each one of our programs - providing hope to children and families. Services include: home visitation and prevention focused case management when a child is able to live at home; an emergency shelter for when children are removed from their home due to abuse and neglect; longer term residential care for girls in foster care; and finally, if a child is adopted or re-unified with kin, our services are able to support this transition back to family life and better ensure that the child is able to thrive. www.hopecfc.org
