



Showing Love Through Action in the Dominican Republic Interview with Rob Hammett

Rob Hammett went on the 2023 Dominican Republic mission trip with his oldest daughter, Mary English. He was among the first to sign up for the 2024 trip, and will be taking his youngest daughter Eloise. We asked Rob about his experience on this annual mission trip and how it has impacted his life.

Why did you want to go on the D.R. Mission Trip in both 2023 and 2024?

First Presbyterian Church has a long-standing history with Solid Rock International in the Dominican Republic. My wife Callie went on this same mission trip with her parents 28 years ago, and I found great meaning in serving the same mission as they did. I am going back to the D.R. alongside my daughter so we can experience serving others together.

What did you learn while you were there?

The book of James teaches us to show our love for others through action. I have always felt my best gift to our church is through service, whether it be coaching church league basketball or assisting with our youth program. I went on this mission trip to serve others, and I truly saw how my small contributions made a deep and direct impact to others.

How did the trip impact you?

When our work was complete, we were able to play with the children who lived nearby. This was perhaps my favorite part of the day. They are a true example of hope and love. Their smiles, excited laughter, and hugs brought many of us to tears. It was a true gift to witness their faith and hope, and that memory will never fade.

ACROSS THE GLOBE

Providing Clean Water in Cuba: A 23/24 Witness Season Update by Kevin DeMark

I wanted to update the congregation of First Presbyterian Church on the 2023/24 Witness Season project, Living Waters for the World (LWW) which trains volunteers to establish and lead water mission teams to implement sustainable water purification systems. David Foy, Holt Andrews, Chris Groke, and myself have attended Living Waters' Clean Water U and have successfully acquired the knowledge to implement a system at the Santa Clara Church in Cuba.

In early October 2023, Holt, David, and I traveled to Santa Clara, Cuba to meet with the in-country LWW representative and the Pastor Reile of Santa Clara Church to verify the location of the system installation as well as the requirements necessary to make the installation trip. We assisted with designing a system and reviewed the adjacency of the water tap, the power connections, and the drains necessary to implement the system. We found a suitable area, but it will require slightly more pipe materials than originally anticipated.

We also discussed with Pastor Reile the need for additional people needed to keep the system working, including an education team and an operations team. The operations team will be made-up of several parishioners of the church who will be responsible for maintaining day-to-day operations along with the maintenance of the filters, pump, and cleaning.

The education team will be responsible for keeping informed both the church and local community surrounding the Church of Santa Clara. Pastor Reile introduced us to the education team leader, who is a local surgeon and an active member of the church. We shared both the hard copy and a digital copy of all the educational materials. The surgeon told us he would review these details and work on making them accurate for both church members and the local community.

Construction materials and labor in Cuba are very slow, and for a long time, the team in Santa Clara was unable to find necessary materials. But God works in mysterious ways. Just when hope for getting these materials was frustrating the team in Cuba, the materials and labor arrived. Our hope is to return this year to complete the project. Be on the lookout for opportunities to help bring Fresh Water to Santa Clara.
