Easter Sunrise Service and Fellowship


Sunday, April 17th 6:30am - 7:15am

From the Peace and Justice Taskforce

Racial Healing Circles are conversations that honor and value each person's humanity, better reflect our common humanity, and build mutually respectful relationships across racial difference to bring about racial healing and repair in communities. They were developed as part of the Truth, Racial Healing, and Transformation (TRHT) framework by Dr. Gail Christopher, who was the City of Spartanburg's MLK Unity Celebration keynote speaker in 2020 just before the pandemic closed everything down. As she puts it, "A racial healing circle is not just a conversation, not just a safe space. It is an experience that engages the heart and requires the heart to be open and expansive. It re-affirms the humanity in all of us. It is a commitment to acknowledging that unconscious bias lives in all of us, and it is the spiritual work of affirming and loving ourselves."
