



<u>Chancel Choir</u>: the flagship musical group of FPC, the Chancel Choir rehearses Wednesdays at 7:30 PM and sings most Sundays at the 11:00 AM worship service, and offers special programs in the Advent and Lenten seasons. This December the choir will be singing seasonal portions of G. F. Handel's *Messiah*.

Genesis Choir: perfect for singers whose schedule is difficult. The Genesis Choir meets at 8:00 AM two Sundays a month and learns music for that day's 8:45 AM sanctuary service. The music is manageable enough to be prepared in 30 minutes and this choir is a valued part of our early services.


