

From the Peace and Justice Taskforce

The Peace and Justice Taskforce of First Presbyterian Church Spartanburg is called to provide educational opportunities for our congregation, both within and outside of the walls of our church, to help each of us grow in understanding of the complex issues surrounding our faith and equity. In March, we are highlighting a local effort called The Echo Project. This effort is working to build relationships that bridge the divide of racism. The Echo Theater is a formerly segregated movie theater located off the courthouse square in downtown Laurens, South Carolina. It is most well-known for its association with the KKK, the American Nazi Party, and the 25th Aryan Nations World Congress. Between 1996 and 2012, the Echo Theater was the site of the "World Famous Redneck Shop," a white supremacist storefront and KKK Museum. The store sold racist memorabilia, KKK robes, and served as a meeting place for Klansmen, Neo-Nazis, and other white supremacist organizations. In the ultimate act of forgiveness, Rev. David Kennedy, a Black Baptist Minister and Civil Rights activist, took in Michael Burden Jr., a Klansmen who lived at



the store. Rev. Kennedy and his church gave Burden a home, food for his family, and a place to worship after Burden decided to walk away from the Klan. As a token of thanks, Burden sold Rev. Kennedy partial ownership of "The Redneck Shop." After a long legal battle, it was ruled that rightful ownership of the property was held by Rev. Kennedy and his church, with "The Redneck Shop" finally closing in 2012. Now, The Echo Project is taking the Echo Theater and transforming it into a place of truth, remembrance, and healing. The team is working to provide historical context to visitors with compelling exhibits, community-driven education, and historical research that will be the backbone of a diversity center that fosters conversations around justice.
