Both in our world and in our church, the past two years have been ones defined by a single word: transition. Of course, COVID forced us all to transition in one way or another from our normal rhythms and routines. But transition has also been a defining word here at First Presbyterian with changes in leadership happening across several key ministry areas. This began with Tom Evans accepting a new call to New York City back in summer 2020 and was followed last year by Holly and Robert Bannan also accepting a new call to serve in Conway, SC.

With the faithful guidance of two outstanding interim leaders - Rev. Lewis Johnson and Rev. Lewis Galloway and the steadfast ministry of the other pastors and staff, you all jumped feet first into this transitional time. My call here earlier this year represented a first step out of those waters, but there were still ongoing searches for new leadership of our youth and children's ministries. And now, after much prayer and a lot of hard work on the part of two search committees, it is such a joy to be able to celebrate the call of two individuals to come serve alongside us in the areas of Youth and Campus Ministry and Children's Ministry.

First, at the congregational meeting on May 22, the congregation voted to call John Daniel DeBevoise as our new Associate Pastor for Youth and Campus Ministry. John Daniel is coming to us from Decatur, GA having just graduated from Columbia Theological Seminary with a Master of Divinity Degree. John Daniel's energy and passion for ministry with youth and college age students is going to quickly make a mark on the lives and faith of our young people and our congregation as a whole. We are thrilled to be welcoming John Daniel as well as his fiancé, Rev. Eliza Smith, who already serves in Spartanburg as the chaplain at Converse University. John Daniel's first day at FPC is June 8.

Second, we are equally excited to be welcoming Kara Clark as our new Director of Children's Ministry. Kara is a seasoned educator having worked as a teacher for the past sixteen years. She has also served in various forms of children and youth ministries at Montreat Conference Center, including as director of Montreat's extensive day camp "Clubs" program. Kara radiates energy and love for doing ministry with children and families, and we could not be more excited to have someone with her experience and creativity stepping into this role! We are also thrilled to have her husband Douglas and their two

children Huntington (8) and Shaffer (4) continue being a part of our church family. Kara's first day at FPC will be August 7.

These two additions to our staff team represent such an exciting new chapter in our ministry together here at FPC. I am mindful though that we would not have gotten here without the hard work of many individuals throughout this transition time. Thank you especially to Ansley Page, Beth Burris, and Carrie Coleman who stepped up in such BIG ways to help provide continuity and leadership in the "in-between time" for these crucial ministries. And thank you too to all the members of the two dedicated search committees who prayerfully went about the work of identifying and calling John Daniel and Kara to come and serve in our midst.


